Rabbi's Message

Dear Temple Beth Shalom Family,

The glow of the installation ceremony and the wonderful gala honoring the Schlesingers has not yet dimmed, yet we are blessed with more wonderful news.

Effective May 15th, Cantor Roni Kripper will be returning to TBS. Many congregants have spoken great praise of Roni's work with our youth and his very positive impact on the entire synagogue through his enormous musical talent. We are thrilled that he will be returning to conduct at least 3 Friday evening services a month as well as resuming his work with our musical services and the award-winning Shabbat ensembles! I am looking forward to experiencing Roni's musical leadership. Baruch Haba, Cantor Roni.

Roni will continue to collaborate with Cantor Emeritus Glenn Gelman and our Chazan Emeritus Rabbi Cantor David Kane on Shabbat morning services and the High Holidays. Twice a month he will lead services and read Torah and our Cantor Emeriti will lead and chant the other two Shabbat morning services each month.

Our congregation has been served by Cantor Gelman since 1991. In addition to his cantorial training, Cantor Gelman studied for 12 years in Yeshiva in metropolitan New York. Cantor Gelman has been a Torah reader for over 40 years and has been teaching Bar/Bat mitzvah students for over 25 years. Throughout the years Cantor Gelman nurtured a strong desire to become a Rabbi. This desire flows from his love for Judaism and his passion for imparting the teachings of Torah to others. Following his heart, Cantor Gelman enrolled in a Yeshiva designed to increase his knowledge and prepare him for a rabbinical Smichah (ordination)

Cantor Gelman completed the rigorous studies required of him under the tutelage of Rabbi J. Hershy Worch of Yeshiva Ateret Zvi and with support from Rabbi Cantor David Kane. Rabbi Worch is the founder of the Open Yeshiva <http://www.openyeshiva.com>. The Open Yeshiva was established to assist those not affiliated with any specific Jewish denomination to acquire Torah learning and rabbinic skills, leading to ordination. The Open Yeshiva is the online annex of the "Yeshiva Ateret Tzvi", a private institute of advanced Jewish Studies situated in Chicago, Illinois, USA.

Cantor Gelman received his rabbinic ordination from Yeshiva Ateret Zvi on March 16th, 2008! Mazel Tov to Rabbi Cantor Glenn Gelman on this great accomplishment. While Rabbi Cantor Gelman's volunteer efforts for the congregation will more or less stay the same, I hope that I can call on him to teach his unique Torah and to share his rabbinic insights in the years to come. All of us at Temple Beth Shalom extend to you a Yasher Koach.

The congregation will have an opportunity to celebrate with Rabbi Cantor Kane at Shabbat services on Saturday, April 12th which will be followed by a festive dairy Kiddush in his honor.

We enter the month of Nissan with anticipation of Pesah. This year at TBS we offer members two wonderful opportunities to enjoy the festival both spiritually and gastronomically. We will offer a beautiful 2nd Night Community Passover Seder on Sunday, April 20th and a 7th Night Pesah-Shabbat Community Dinner on Friday, April 25th. Program: In recognition of Yom Hashoah-Holocaust Memorial Day which follows a few days after Pesah, we bring to you a special program on the Holocaust with two outstanding speakers.

About Leon Leyson, Youngest member of Schindler’s List, Holocaust Survivor.

Oskar Schindler, who became known to the world through Steven Spielberg’s Academy Award winning movie *Schindler’s List*, chose to become a rescuer. Leon Leyson was thirteen years old when his father brought him into Schindler’s enamelware factory. Because they were protected by Schindler and members of the “List,” young Leon, his mother, father, and older sister and brother all survived the war. Two other brothers, and all of Leyson’s extended family, were killed. After the war, Mr. Leyson spent three years in a displaced persons camp near Frankfurt, Germany. He came to the United States in 1949, served in the U.S. Army, and became a teacher. He taught at Huntington Park High School for 39 years. Mr. Leyson has been featured in several documentaries and television programs and appeared with Steven Spielberg on the *Today* show commemorating the tenth anniversary of the release of *Schindler’s List*.

About Professor Marilyn Harran, Director of the Rodgers Center and Stern Chair in Holocaust Education, Chapman University.

Dr. Harran has been honored by The “1939” Club with their first “Teacher of the Holocaust” award. She has received the “Woman of Excellence” award from Learning for Life; the “Leader of Distinction” award from the Anti-Defamation League of Orange County and Long Beach, and has been recognized for her contributions by the Orange County Human Relations Council. She has received fellowships and awards from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Mellon Foundation, and the International Research & Exchanges Board. In 1995-96, she served as chair of the faculty at Chapman University. In 1997, 2001, and 2007, Chapman University students chose Dr. Harran as Faculty Member of the Year.
